

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SLP ZONES OF FOCUS



- A. The School Community
- B. The Adjacent School Neighbourhood
- C. The Residential Communities of the Students
- D. The National Community



Service Learning project Rationale

- Complements academic curriculum
- Addresses deficiency in 'soft skills'
- Opportunity to assume meaningful roles
- Opportunity to respond to real needs in society



Outcomes of SLP

- Appreciate civic responsibilities
- Develop social values
- Foster spirit of volunteerism
- Cultivate responsibility
- Promote decision making
- Feel valued








Requirements of SLP

▶ 30 hours



(2 x 15) hours OR (10 + 20) hours

- Maximum 3 projects
 - 10 hours each





Guidelines

- Students are required to volunteer their time to improve their community
- Community service projects must be completed within two years
- Service Learning Projects MUST have school approval
- Projects must be conducted with non-profit organizations or disadvantaged members of the community
- Must meet a demonstrated need

Guidelines Cont'd

- Supervised by an adult (not a relative)
- Cannot receive compensation or be of benefit to the student's personal organization (raising funds for school team)
- Recipients of service cannot be family members
- Students cannot be credited for being part of a team or club. However, if the team/club participates in a walk for a cause the walk itself would be considered community service

Guidelines Too

- In essence the community service must better the community at large
- A document that verifies the completion of hours must be submitted to the school
- All community service documentation must be signed by the DIRECT SUPERVISOR
- A reflective journal must be compiled should include visuals of involvement in the project

Certification of SLP

- Students must compile a journal (including pictures) of one (1) or two (2) pages maximum
- May be submitted in hard or electronic copy
- Must include reflection (written or oral recorded)
- Verified by person and organization in charge of activity
- Certified by school






WHAT'S NEW ABOUT CCSLC
